1. Describe your education. If you were married during any part of your education, describe in detail the sources of all monies for your educational expenses and support of your household during that period.

3. Did you support your spouse or were you supported by your spouse while attending school?
4. Is your spouse self-employed? List the nature of their business and their approximate income from said business. Is the business licensed in Tennessee or Mississippi? If not, where?

MARRIAGE:

1. List all of the prior marriages of your spouse and yourself. Also list how the marriage ended and if there were children from that marriage. List the names and dates of birth of each child and where that each child lives.
2. How long have you been married to your current spouse?
3. What marital problems have you had? (Describe in detail: What happened, when, where, witnesses, etc.)
4. Describe in detail the final separation. (Who left whom? When? Where? Why? What events led up to the separation? Witnesses?)
5. Have the police have been called to your residence or the resident of another regarding any arguments between you and your spouse? (Where? When? What was the outcome?)

6. Have you and your spouse ever been separated before? Were divorce or separation papers filed with a court?

7. Have you ever been guilty of misconduct? Are you or have you during the marriage had a romantic relationship with someone other than your spouse? Who? Where? When? Is your spouse having a romantic relationship with another person now or during the marriage? Has your spouse had a relationship with another person? If so, Who? Where? When?

8. List all of the gifts that you or your spouse have given their romantic "friend."

9. Who can testify to your spouse's treatment of you during the marriage? (Note: Someone who has eye-witnessed misconduct in your marriage, not what you have told someone.)

#### MISCELLANEOUS

1. List all real property that you and your spouse own together.

2. List all real property that you own in your name only.

3. List all real property that your spouse owns in their name only.

4. List all assets over the amount of \$500.00 that you and your spouse own or are in the marital residence.

5. List all assets you claim are separate property.

6. List all of your credit cards in your sole name only, giving balances and monthly payments.

7. List all of your spouse's credit cards in their sole name only, giving balances and monthly payments.

8. List all of your joint credit cards in both names, giving balances and monthly payments.

9. List all professional or occupational licenses, certificates or qualifying paper you or your spouse hold and when they were obtained.

10. State what religious institutions that you or your spouse belong to and for how long.

11. State you and your spouse's health. If there are problems, list in detail the specific health problem and if they are currently being treated by a physician. Name your physician and your spouse's physician. List all disabilities that you or your spouse may have.

12. State the children's health and if there are any specific problems. State whether or not they are currently under medication or under a doctor's care for such health problems.

13. Provide names and addresses of all psychiatrist, psychologist or counselors you have seen in the past two years, and the reasons for their treatment. Describe your emotional health at the time of your marriage. Do the same for your spouse.

14. Describe your physical health at the time of your marriage.

15. If you or your spouse are not employed, state why.

16. State to the best of your ability what you want and expect as a result of any dissolution litigation. Make reference to alimony, child support, and property (both real and personal).

17. State your desired settlement of this divorce. (What agreeable terms you could reach with your spouse.)

18. Do you or your spouse need vocational training to rehabilitate yourself or your spouse? If so, describe in full and state the time and expense involved in the training.

19. List names, addresses and telephone numbers of all witnesses who may be able to testify on your behalf and state briefly what they may say. **PLEASE SPECIFY IF SPECIAL ARRANGEMENTS MAY BE NEEDED TO OBTAIN THEM AS A WITNESS.**

20. List the names, addresses and telephone numbers of all witnesses who may testify against you and state briefly what they might say.

21. Describe in detail any monetary contributions from a source unconnected with the marriage. For example, list money which you had prior to the marriage or that you received by gift or inheritance during your marriage.

22. State all assets that were yours prior to the marriage that you brought into the marriage.

23. List all stock, bonds, retirement plans, bank accounts, giving the name on the account, sole or marital property, the balance in the account, and who contributed to the account during the marriage.

24. List all stock brokerage firms that you or your spouse have dealt with during your marriage.

25. Have you or your spouse reached any agreement? If so, give the details of the agreement.

26. List all loans from the past five years that you or your spouse have received giving details as to whose name the loan is listed the amount, for what, the balance and the monthly payment.

27. Has there been any wasteful spending or dissipation of assets by either you or your spouse?

28. During the past five years, have you and your spouse filed Income tax returns? Jointly? Have there been refunds?

29. State whether you or your spouse have any claims for losses, damages or reimbursement which you or your spouse, jointly or individually my have against any other person, firm or agency, giving the estimated value thereof. Any lawsuits filed with any court?

30. List all tax identification numbers for all entities in which you or your spouse have an interest.
